This book covers all interesting facts about the World war. Austria- Hungary declared war on Serbia, Russia and Germany declared war on each other. This decision started what many had feared: a war involving the great powers of Europe. On the same day, Russia's ally, France, ordered a general mobilization. It was now clear that a peaceful agreement could no longer be reached. Before the official declaration of war, Germany had warned Russia, which was at that point only partially mobilized, that further mobilization against Austria meant war with the German Empire.

I wish my elementary history books were like this I could just memorize it in 50 events. Geesh, I had so many sleepless nights with history and hated it to bits especially the dates.
